Delete a virtual machine

UPDATE

In the Armor Management Portal (AMP), you can delete your virtual machine immediately, or at the end of the billing cycle.

Previously, when you deleted your virtual machine immediately, you were still charged for the entire billing cycle.

Now, when you immediately delete a virtual machine, while you will still see a charge, you will also see a credit to offset this cost.
