Disabled users and corresponding roles

In the **Armor Management Portal (AMP)**, when a user is disabled, that user's roles will also be disabled; you cannot add or remove that user's roles. Previously, a disabled user's roles were configurable. Now, you cannot update a user's role when that user is disabled.

Display CoreInstance ID

This topic only applies to **Armor Anywhere** users.

In the **Armor Management Portal (AMP)**, in the **Virtual Machines** screen, the CoreInstance ID is now listed.

The vulnerability scan reports only list the CoreInstance ID, not the name of the virtual machine or server. Now, the **Virtual Machines** screen in AMP includes an entry for the CoreInstance ID, along the same row as the corresponding virtual machine or server.
